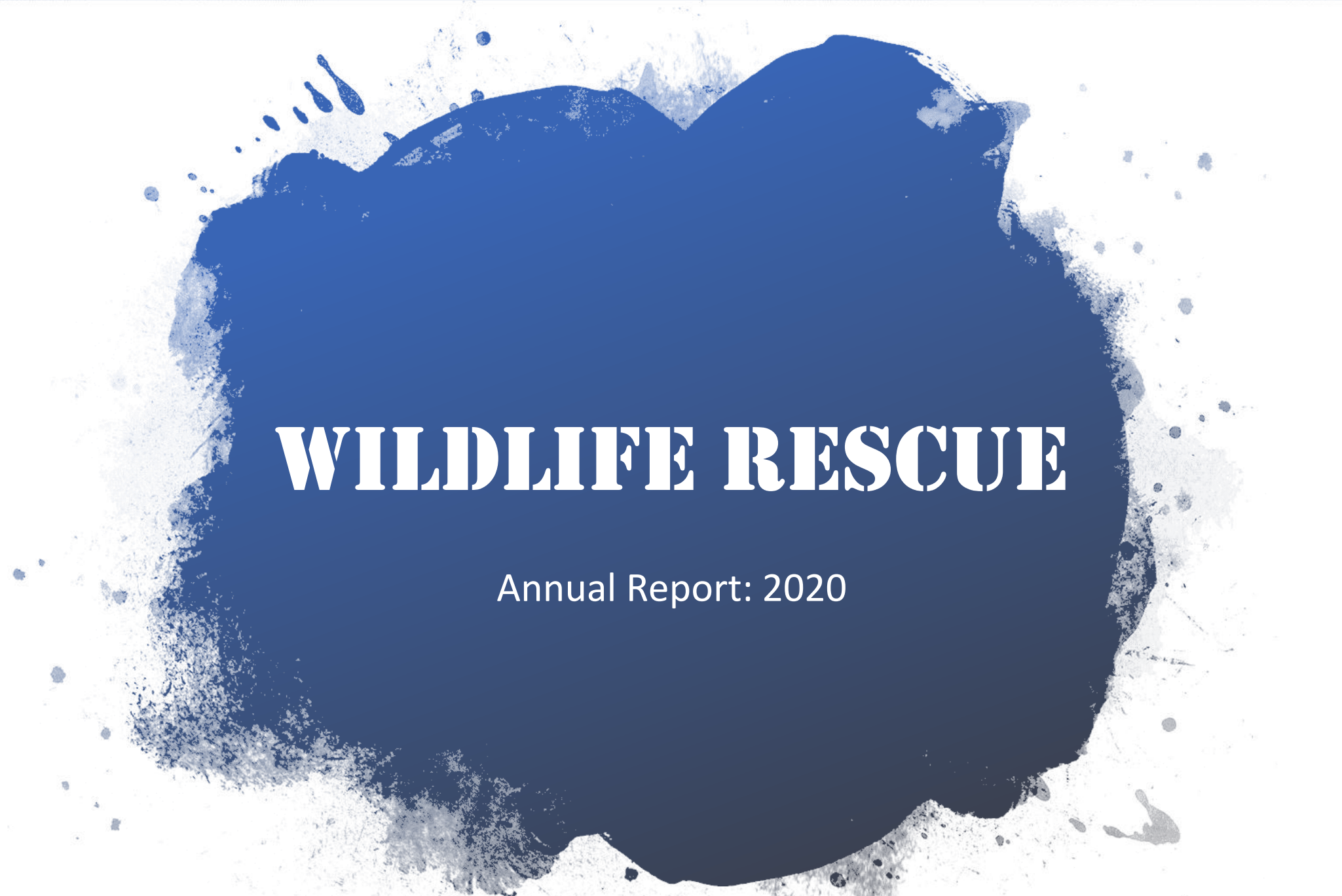

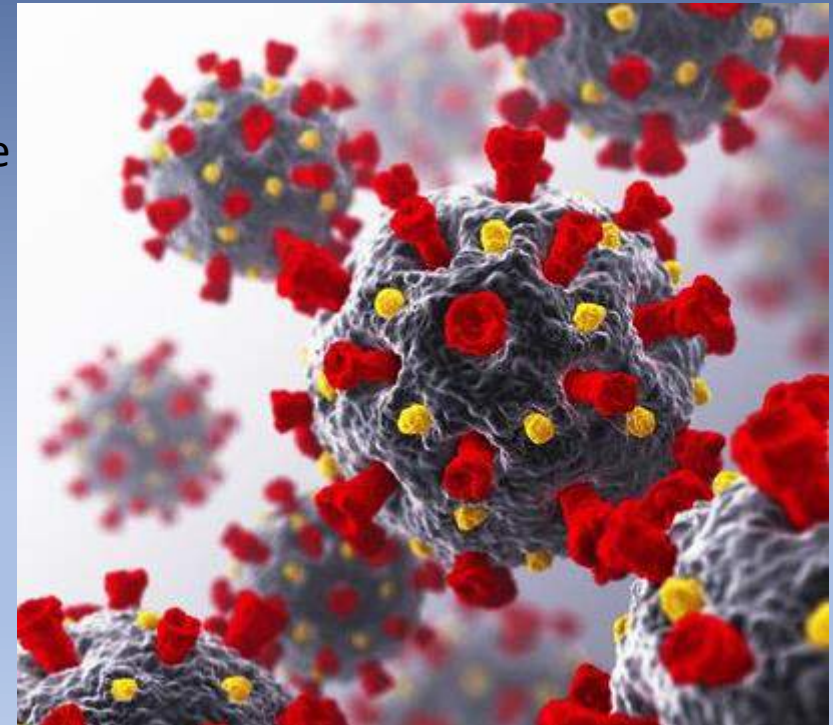
Annual Report: 2020

2020

The Year of uncertainties and difficulties

- Wildlife Rescue was fully functional in Covid lockdowns and was always running around for rescues
- Due to lock down and people staying at home: a huge number of paper kite flying
- We received more than the normal load of wounded birds
- There was limited food supply for the birds and there were a lot of difficulties we faced.
- Limited to no donations made our operations difficult as the food prices soared

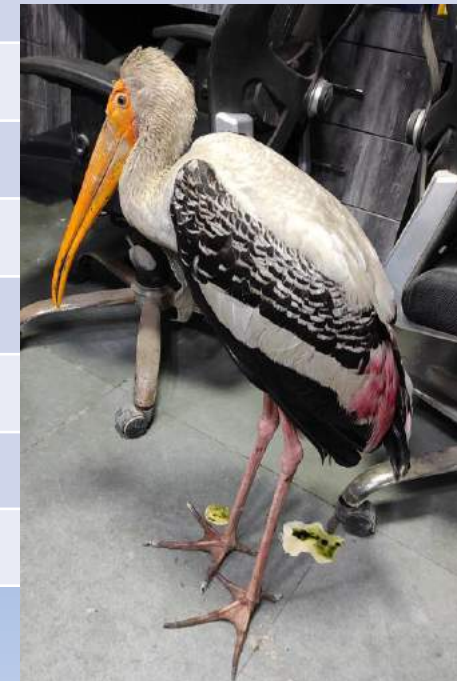

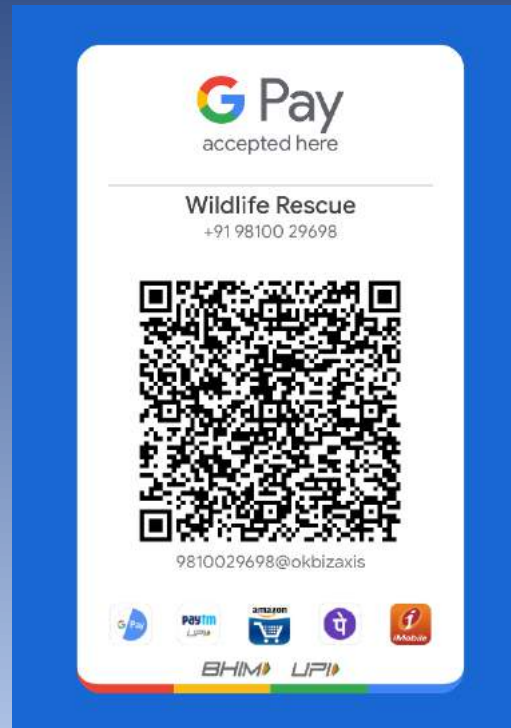

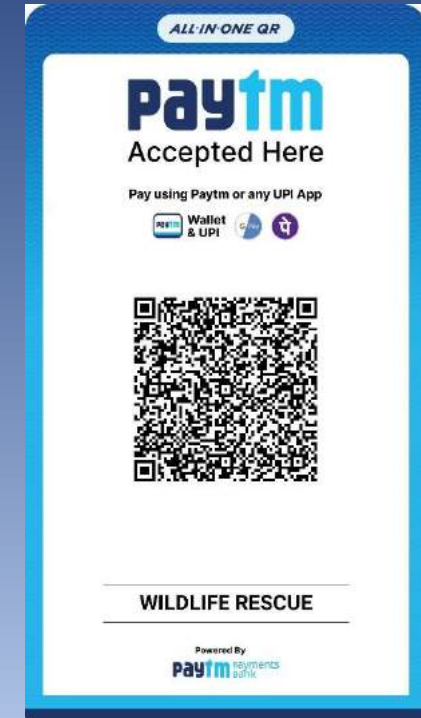
